2026WOMEN Tribunal invites you to participate in this vibrant, inspiring, multidisciplinary exchange celebrating the importance and impact of women's voices, testimonies, courage, and hope—uniting women through art, activism, and sisterhood.

A four-day artistic residency will take place prior to the event to co-create a powerful performance “**صوتي Mijn Stem**”, bringing together 40 women of diverse age, origin, background and social class, from the port cities of Antwerp, Marseille, Barcelona and Rotterdam. The performance radiates the resilience and resistance of women, turning testimony into movement, injustice into art and trauma into shared strength.

All 2026Women Tribunal ARTivist and ACTivist activities are proposed by an international network of over forty feminist, socio-artistic and academic organisations that work with a FINTA (Female, Intersex, Non-binary, Trans, Agender) public at community level to promote gender equality, solidarity and empowerment.
